

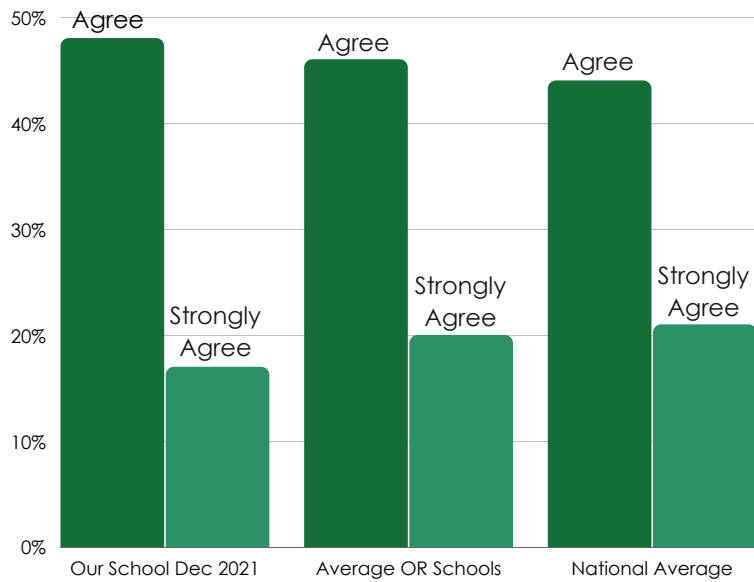
Students and families at Ron Russell were surveyed in December 2021 about their perceptions of their school in terms of Engagement, Academic Challenge, Instructional Methods, Culture, Belonging, and Relationships. In addition, students provided feedback about School Safety and Emotional and Mental Health.

We heard from 85% of students and 10% of families.

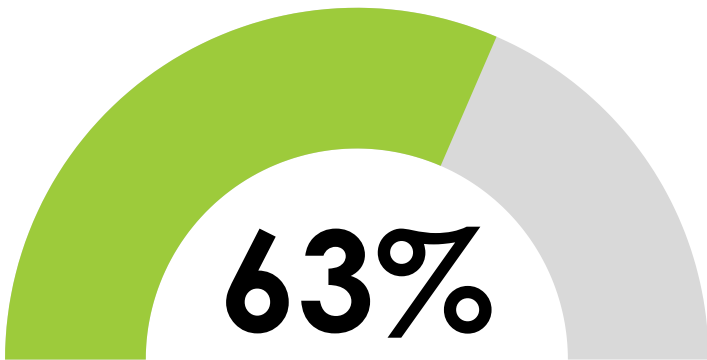
With the help of the nonprofit YouthTruth, we analyzed their responses to use for decision-making and improvements. Here are a few things we learned from the survey:



65% of students either agree or strongly agree that most students are friendly to them.



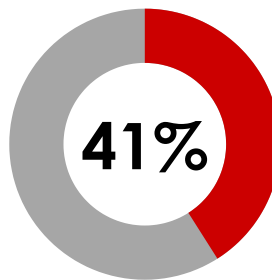
The amount of students who believe that their teachers want them to explain their answers - why they think what they think.



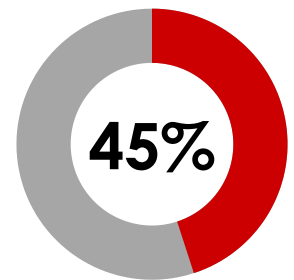
The amount of families who believe they receive regular feedback about their child's progress.

The national average is 64%, and the average in Oregon is 56%.
